

Paper Pinwheel

NOTE: For this craft you'll need a straight pin (like what you'd use for sewing), a small bead that has a hole big enough to thread onto the pin, and a pencil with an eraser.

1. Color in the two sides.
2. Cut out the pinwheels around the outer edges.
3. Glue the two together to make it double sided (make sure that the lines and circles are aligned when gluing the two sides together).
4. Cut the diagonal slits.
4. Fold the corners with the circles in towards the center circle, so each of the circles is stacked on top of each other.
5. With an adult's help, use a pin to poke through each of the circles, then thread a small bead onto the pin, and poke it into the eraser on the pencil.
6. Blow on your pinwheel and watch it spin!
